

Additionally, from August 26 to September 6, 2024, 9 students from Tokyo Institute of Technology will visit. Students with above N4 level can apply for the Saitama program,

while any student can apply for the Tokyo Tech program, regardless of Japanese language proficiency. These exchange programs offer a unique opportunity for cultural immersion, academic collaboration, and personal growth, allowing students to broaden their horizons and build international connections.
