Advice to Juniors

To those who are hoping to follow a similar path, our first and strongest piece of advice is to take the Japanese language seriously. Even a basic level of fluency can give you a significant edge. Don't be afraid to make mistakes while speaking confidence and willingness to try are often more important than perfection.

We also encourage you to build a solid portfolio. Treat your academic assignments and projects with care, especially your final year and group projects, as they are often discussed during interviews. It's important to keep records of what you've built and to be ready to explain your role and what you learned.

Communication is another key area. Whether in English or Japanese, being able to clearly express your thoughts and experiences is vital. Practicing your self-introduction and preparing answers to common interview questions can help you feel more confident when the time comes. Getting involved in university activities, such as student clubs and events, can also give you a competitive advantage. These experiences help shape your personality

and provide great talking points during interviews. Keep exploring beyond the classroom technologies like Linux, Git, system architecture, and even new programming languages can help you stand out.

Lastly, don't be discouraged by setbacks. Rejections are part of the journey, but each one is a chance to improve and grow. Stay determined, stay curious, and keep moving forward.

We would not have reached this point without the incredible support of our lecturers, mentors, and the entire LNBTI community. From academic guidance to personal encouragement, they have played an irreplaceable role in our journey.
