The Vice Chancellor's Message



In early September, LNBTI received wonderful news — seven of our students were selected for fully funded internship opportunities at top Japanese IT companies.

These internships are truly special, as they cover return airfare between Japan and Sri Lanka, accommodation, food, and all job-related travel expenses in Japan. The students were selected purely based on merit. LNBTI proposed several names, and the respective Japanese companies independently selected seven among them.

What do these students have in common?

They all have excellent academic performance with high GPAs, and they have all passed the JLPT N3 level by the time they applied. The interviews were conducted entirely in Japanese, and those who successfully impressed the interviewers were given the opportunity to begin working in Japan — even before completing their degree! These students are currently in their third year, with one more year to go before graduation.

They are the pioneers of LNBTI's new academic concept —
"Study in Sri Lanka and Work in Japan as an IT Professional."

Now, there is no need to make onetime payment of millions of rupees to the agents to find a job in a highly developed country like Japan. Pay the LNBTI program fee in installments, and gain your competence as required in the Japanese industry. The path is now clear for all LNBTI students:

1.Study IT diligently at LNBTI and perform well in your exams.

2.Develop your Japanese language skills to at least JLPT-N3 level to communicate effectively.

3.Succeed in company interviews to secure your opportunity.

Remember, both IT and Japanese language skills are equally important. Having only one of them will not be enough. To work successfully in Japan, you need both. No exceptions.
